The next week, we got a bit soggy with water games. We took a quick look at the water safety code as we dried off between games. We folded paper boats and it was great fun to see how far we could float them down the burn. Fishing all of the soggy boats out after the Beavers left was slightly less fun!



Back to basics the following week for tracking. We investigated all of the different symbols we might see/use, then split off into two teams to set each other some treasure trails to follow.



The weather forced us into the hall the following week for our only indoor night of the term. We tried our hand at making another sweet treat – armpit fudge. Much tastier than the name would suggest!

Back outside again the next week for bug hunting and pond dipping. To our surprise, we found freshwater shrimp in the Lyne Burn. Apparently, these are an indicator of water quality, so a good sign for the area.



We spent our penultimate week developing our teamwork skills. We kicked off with a couple of games of Beaver rounders. We built the trickiest obstacle courses that we could to challenge each other, before racing to complete them all in the fastest time we could.

We ended the term with our traditional Summer BBQ, albeit on a slightly smaller scale. On small BBQs at the side of the hall, we cooked hot dogs and s'mores. We then spent the rest of the night trying to keep it all down as we got stuck into some final games.



We've welcomed new Beavers and worked towards loads of different badges this term, including the adventure, teamwork, and outdoor challenges, and hope to be giving these out to lots of the Beavers next term as we tidy up the few remaining requirements.




# Arran Pack



**Our Environmental project** is moving forward. The Explorers and adults have been clearing the burn and removing the seemingly endless shopping trolleys.

The Test plot for the wildflower meadow is just beginning to bloom but it is clear that the area we chose is infested with bind weed and so we have found a more suitable location for the bee and butterfly meadow further downstream. We hope to clear it and start planting before the winter sets in ready for next year. We will be looking for fund/sponsorship so that we can buy seeds for bee and butterfly friendly plants. We have already had some donations of seed from The Plant market and 1kg of poppy seeds from Callum Farquhar our Regional Commissioner. If you know anyone who would be willing to donate for seeds then please let us know. 1Kg of mixed seeds can be bought for around £50 and is enough to plant 100 square metres.

The Beavers have been surveying the burn and found freshwater shrimp which is an indicator organism that shows that we have a good quality of water. In addition we have discovered minnows in the burn so the wildlife in the burn is looking good. The biggest news is that we have been lucky in sourcing 210 trees and shrubs for planting in the autumn. The Woodland trust donated tree pack for schools and community groups and our project has qualified for 2 packs of native trees, these trees have been chosen because they support a lot of wildlife.

We will have oak, hawthorn, willow, birch and blackthorn trees and with 210 trees we have the opportunity for every member of the group to plant a tree. We plan on a lot of work in clearing the brambles and nettles after summer to allow the planting to go ahead.

In addition to the trees for wildlife we have plans to create a community orchard in partnership with the Touch community council in the triangular shaped land across the road from the hall. More news on that later in the year.



Beaver Scouts officially became part of the Scout Association on the 1st of April 1986. That makes Beavers an incredible 35 years old this year!


This Summer, we'd like you to join us in celebrating Beavers' 35th Birthday with 35 exciting challenges and activities.


