# Hudson Beaver

## Colony



After an outdoor term earlier in the year, the Hudson Colony headed inside for the majority of this term and set our sights on the Teamwork, Health and Fitness, Disability Awareness, and Air Activities badges.



We kicked off the term with our usual games night and made the most of the sunny evening, heading outside to play dodge-ball, rounders, tag and loads of other games. We had our first log-chew of the term – a chat with all of the Beavers to hear what they'd like to do at Beavers. They came up with lots of exciting new ideas and we've done our best to incorporate them this term and plan them into next term.

We made ourselves a healthy snack as part of our Health and Fitness badge – Apple Doughnuts! We cut rings of apple, covered them in yoghurt, and decorated them with berries, granola, dried mango, and honey. Even the Beavers (and Leaders!) who weren't too keen on fruit to start with thought they were tasty! We also investigated healthy

foods, checked what happens to our pulse during exercise, and thought about how we could convince people to eat healthily.

The following week, we re-set all of our Lodges (the groups we stand/work in at Beavers), assigned some new Lodge Leaders, and got stuck into some team-building activities. We played all of our favourite team games including Bash the Beaver, Hockey, and Crab Football, and our new Lodge Leaders had a think about what makes a good Leader.

Inspired by this years' events in Tokyo, we went on to try our hand at some Paralympic events. We had a go at seated volleyball and being a guide for a blind athlete in a race. We continued on this theme the following week with some Disability Awareness activities. We invested in some equipment to try out Goalball – a first time for all of the Beavers and Leaders! Usually in the Paralympics, athletes are blind and use a ball with bells inside to try to score goals by throwing the ball. With no goals scored by anybody, I think we need a bit more practice at this one! We also tried to imagine what life might be like if any of us were disabled, trying a number of activities without using our sight and/or hearing.



We set our sights on the skies the next week with the Air activities badge. We made gliders and planes, practised parachute rolls, tried our hand at the phonetic alphabet, and explored some interesting types of air-crafts.

Our final evening of the term was open to visitors. Split into our different lodges, we tried to complete a variety of fun challenges together to show off all of our Scouting skills. Loads of parents/carers came to join in the fun. Challenges included tower building, naming animals, making human tables and seats, and using chopsticks.

Things got a little bit competitive and a fantastic night was had by all.

Next term we'll be trying some new adventurous activities outside, putting our circus skills to the test, getting spooky for Halloween, and getting a little bit festive towards Christmas time (to name just a small selection). It's going to be awesome!

You went caving, grass sledging, shot arrows on the archery range, flew down the new zip line, abseiled, climbed, played sumo and stacked up towers of crates to climb on. 



Hi everyone,

As we are celebrating our 50th anniversary those of you who were not here when our Group was created are wondering how it all started so I will give you a potted version entitled

## “In The Beginning”

In June 1971 I was approached by a Mrs Turnbull of Touch Tenants Association asking me if I could start a Scout Group for the benefit of the youngsters of the new housing scheme in Touch. Agreeing to this I spoke to Harry Campbell and Angela Kerr, both of whom were assistants of mine in the 41st Fife in Rosyth and they were keen to be involved. I also contacted Ian Parnell who had been a scout Leader in a now closed Group in Dunfermline.

Steps were taken to register the Group with the local Commissioner and given the all clear in September that year. Youngsters of scout and cub age were very interested and our first meetings were held in Woodmill High School in October. Later that year we discovered that the Council were to build a temporary community centre in Garvock Bank for the benefit of organisations in Touch. When it was opened I was able to book two nights every week for our Cubs and Scouts. Noting the 'temporary' in the title I approached the Council indicating our desire to purchase the building when available. This was repeated annually for three years and financial help with a loan from Dunfermline Carnegie Trust we eventually secured it.

Then came the next challenge enlarging the hall to suit our needs. Fundraising, grants, a loan from the Trust and the help of Group parents, contacts in the building trades and generous help, within several months our hall was completed, with a flat roof.

During the early years a neighbour mine worked the dockyard and he mentioned that several temporary buildings there to be sold off. One of these was a hut which had been built as a science lab in 1923. Upshot was I was put in touch with the contractor who was buying it and they were prepared to let us have it if we dismantled it and took it away.

We contacted a farmer in Powmill who had an old quarry located within his farm and agreed to our use of that to build the old hut. So sleeves rolled up and a team of leaders and parents along with a hired lorry we dismantled the hut and delivered it to Powmill. There we discovered the main roof timbers were so old and brittle we had to buy new ones.


To save on the cost it was agreed that our team were to deliver them ourselves on a Sunday morning early strapped to the roof of our newly acquired Group van with yours truly in the driving seat and a car in front and another behind. Quite a challenge! The rest is more well known but the success of our Group depends not only on the skills and keenness of leaders but on the wonderful support of our Executive committee and parents.

The Yellow Giraffes were the winning six for September! Congratulations




# Where your badges go ....

A question we get asked all the time! Please pull out and keep these pages as a guide for not just your first uniform but what to move when you change sections

## ALL sections

### Right Sleeve



Hudson Colony, McKenzie Colony, Arran Pack, Skye Pack, Tonkawa Troop, Ben Cleuch Unit or (?) Squirrel Dray

Lodge, Six or Patrol badge. Note that not all sections use these, you may have a coloured woggle on your neckie to indicate your Lodge or Six

Leadership Award, colours vary from section to section



Explorers who are also Young Leaders will wear the acorn badge in the leadership position, gaining the leaves as they complete their modules

## All Sections

### Left front of Sweatshirts

Scout/Explorer Shirt—purple world badge goes on pocket & others just above

Occasional badges are for special events e.g. our 50th birthday badge. They should only be worn for the year that they relate to then removed, or replaced by the new badge for the next special event.



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This is your scout 'birthday' badge, they are awarded every year on the anniversary of the date you made your first promise.



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# All Sections

## Right front of Sweatshirts & Scout/Explorer Shirt

This side of your uniform is for awards that you have gained



Colours will vary between sections

The challenge awards are hexagonal and space should be left at the top for the Chief Scouts Award

(Illustration is the scout section awards)

## All Sections

### Left Sleeve

Your left sleeve is for all your activity and staged badges. These are round in shape.

Staged badges are blue with a purple border for all sections, activity badges will vary (illustration is staged & beavers)

#### When you move up to the next section

Transfer the badges as follows:

##### Right Sleeve

- 1) Group Tape to be moved
- 2) You will receive a new tape so leave this one
- 3) Scotland Flag to be moved
- 4) Fife/Dunfermline to be moved

##### Left Front

5) you will receive a new moving on badge for each section, Squirrels to Beavers is lime green with a blue border, Beavers to Cubs is yellow with a red border, Cubs to Scouts is red with a blue border, Scouts to Explorers is green with a blue border & Explorers to Network is blue with a blue border.


6) Year Stars—when you change section please move the highest one only and position to the left so that more can be added in time.

7) membership badge to be moved.

8) Chief Scouts Acorn, Bronze, Silver, Gold, Platinum & Diamond awards can be moved to your new uniform, position so that new challenge awards can be added as gained.

9) Staged Badges—these follow you through your scouting journey, please only move the highest stage to your new uniform. Scouts & Explorers replace existing with higher stage when gained.

10) Activity badges do not get moved



If you want to keep your uniform for a keepsake when you change sections, new badges can be purchased. Speak to your section leaders.


