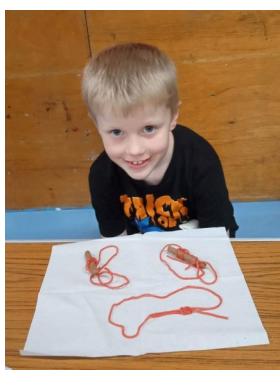

We ran a Bring a Friend night where we played some games, learnt how to use the bushcraft knives, lit a fire and then made some s'mores despite the bad weather.

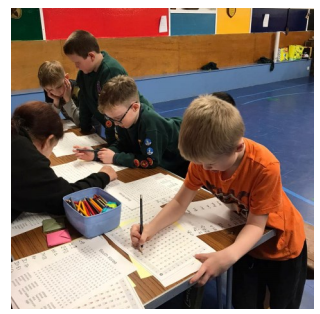

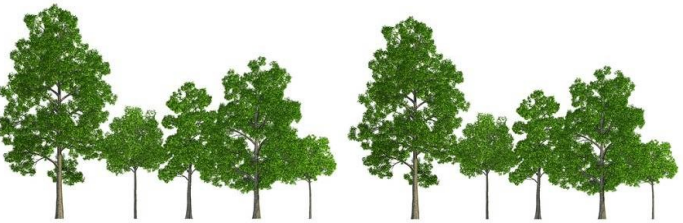
Practising knots with strawberry laces and chocolate fingers, tasted good too!

A big thanks to our leaders, young leader and parent helpers for assisting each week, this is most welcome as our colony is growing.

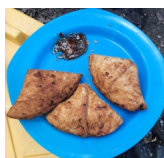
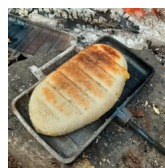


# EXPLORERS

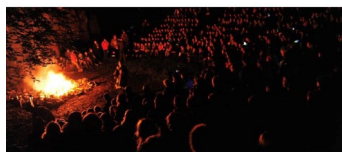
This year we reached 52 different countries out of 190. (5 don't have Scouts, North Korea, Laos, Myanmar, China & Andorra)

Mag brought his amateur radio gear along and spoke to a couple of other Scout Groups, he also used a web based communication system to reach other countries across the globe.

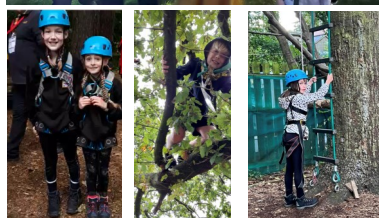




# Arran Pack

Back in the hall there were Kims Games played, chariot races had and a visit from the Animal Lady as part of their Animal Carer badge.

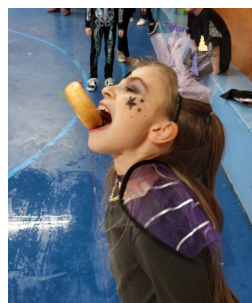


The Autumn term kicked off with a games night at the end of which we handed out a lot of badges to Cubs who missed the end of the previous term!

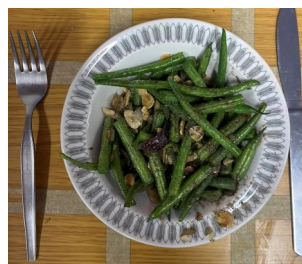
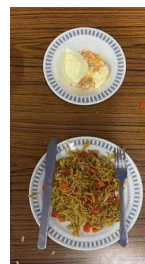
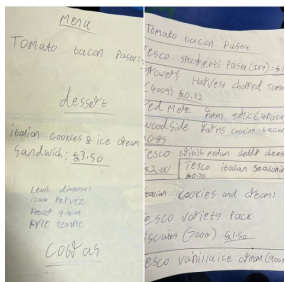
The Scouts learned some new digital skills and after completing some work at home, a few of them were rewarded with their Digital Maker staged badges. Still not too late to finish this one!



A lack of available pumpkins didn't stop the scouts from creating Halloween lanterns, their knife skills were put to the test with a variety of fruit and vegetables as alternatives. Now that loo roll is back in plentiful supply the Scouts made good use of it.



A cooking challenge was issued. The Patrols had to devise their own menu from overseas, complete some fact finding about their chosen country then produce a shopping list. They went to the supermarket, bought everything then cooked their dishes. They were judged on punctuality, presentation, hygiene & tastiness. They were also judged on how challenging the dishes were and on the all important clearing up afterwards. Everything was really tasty & well presented, well done all!



Sedan chair racing is always a fun activity, the Scouts create their Sedans by lashing some staves onto chairs, the smallest member of the Patrol is then transported around a course, with the fastest winning. Sheer lashings were used to join several staves together then the Scouts had to attach a balloon to the end and reach out over a candle until the balloon burst. They also had a competitive fire lighting event. A string is rigged at a set height over the area where the fire is to be lit, the first Patrol to get the fire going high enough to burn through the string wins.

Sticking with the international theme the Scouts completed a number of challenges (very) loosely based on countries where previous World Scout Jamborees have been held.

Scouts had a chance to try out their make up & acting skills when we took a different approach to first aid training. They were coached on how to make wounds, bruises and burns, complete with blisters whilst discussing treatments then had the chance to make up their own scenarios. Once they had everything ready they swapped round and another Patrol then had to treat the casualties.



The Scouts ended the year with their traditional Trading Post, Patrols are given an amount of 'money' to begin with and a list of tasks, some scouty some not so scouty. The aim is to complete as many of the tasks as they can to earn more 'money', the winners are those with the highest amount at the end. This was followed by the Christmas Party night.



# HUDSON BEAVERS

We've had another action-packed term at the Hudson Beavers! Here are some of our highlights.

We took a trip to Lumphinnans pond to see what we could discover and earn our Explorer badges. We used a night in the hall to think about what we might find in and around the pond, and came up with bugs, fish, frogs, toads, and wild sharks! Some weeks later, we headed out to the pond and were guided through some pond dipping. We got close to the water, dipped our nets in, and carefully scooped any living creatures out into viewing beakers. We found loads of different bugs, but no fish or sharks this time! Owen was the only one with wet feet though .....





We spent several weeks working on our Builders badge. First, we built up our building skills with challenges like building strong bridges from newspaper, and constructing stable towers. We then got to the business of designing and planning machines that we could build, thinking about what they would do, how they would work, and what made them unique. Finally, we assembled mountains of recycling, and worked together to bring our plans to life. We had washing machines, doughnut makers, rockets, chocolate factories, sweet makers, and even a robotic Beaver Leader!



Some of the highlights of the Autumn-Winter term are always our Halloween and Christmas activities. At Halloween, we got crafty, making spooky ghosts and bat headwear, and even played a messy doughnut-eating game or two!



At Christmas, we had both a craft night and a full party night. We decorated wooden baubles, assembled jumping reindeer/penguins/snowmen, and decorated the hall with loads of paper chains.

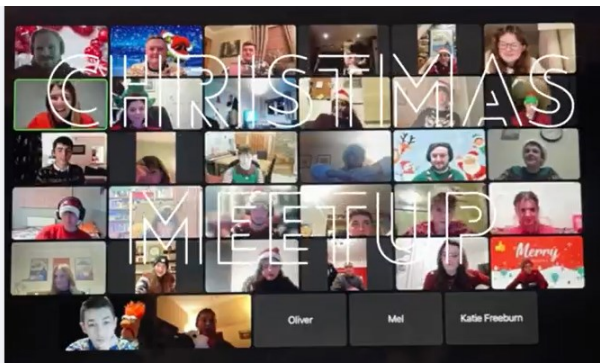
IST members at Bundits of Leith for some Korean food. Would thoroughly recommend!

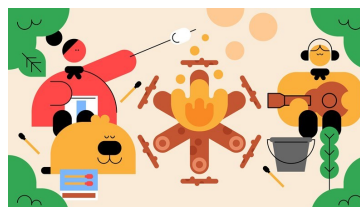
