Katie, Daniel & Niamh were part of the East Region 'Haggis Hot East' Unit that travelled to South Korea via Paris on 25th July. After arriving in Seoul and settling into their hotel the Unit set about exploring the city. As you can see from the photos on the previous page they managed to see quite a lot of it, taking in some of the traditional palaces, museums and taking a trip up to the North Seoul Tower via a rickety cable car. There was also a visit to the DMZ (Demilitarised Zone) where they could see over the border to North Korea and look at the propaganda villages, they also were part of a small ceremony where peace ribbons were left by unit members. During their time in Seoul all the UK units had a chance to take part in a city wide game, Seoul Searching. There were a number of hotspots to visit, challenges to complete and photo evidence to submit. Owing to delays with travelling to site they had some extra days in Seoul where they visited Lotte World amusement park and took a river boat trip.

Finally it was time to travel to the Jamboree Site in Saemangeum, some four hours south by coach.

The Unit were directed to their allocated campsite and got down to the task of getting tents and shelter set up. First time any of us have had to pitch tents on a platform of pallets! The next few days saw the opening ceremony where the flags of all the countries attending were paraded (think Olympics) and speeches were followed by a spectacular drone show and firework display. Security was tight at this event as it was attended by the countries president and first lady. Getting to know the neighbours from different countries and trading of badges, neckies and other items were high on the list of things to do as well as taking part in the activities on offer.

Sadly however, it was not to last, after only a few days the difficult decision was taken to withdraw from the campsite owing to insurmountable difficulties with the provision of facilities, food, medical etc. The whole UK contingent left together with USA and other countries soon followed suit.

So back to Seoul, and Jamboree 2.0 commenced. The IST were drafted in to provide activities and bases, Seoul Searching recommenced and other events were swiftly organised by the city. Free tickets to a football match, an audience with Dwayne Fielding, visit to a waterpark and an aquarium. No visit to Seoul would be complete without a visit to Gangnam and a bit of dancing!

A cultural night was held in the largest underground cathedral in the world



and not one, but three Ceilidhs had to

be organised after it proved to be popular, safe to say the Unit were exhausted after all that dancing! After everyone was taken off the Jamboree site owing to the oncoming typhoon, an amazing closing ceremony was held at the world cup football stadium. Goodie bags were distributed, speeches were kept to a minimum and there was a handover ceremony to the Polish representatives who are hosting the next event in 2027. This was followed by a K-Pop concert where a number of bands performed on stage to the increasing excitement of the audience.



It was not the Jamboree that any of us expected but the most was made of the experience. It definitely shows how far reaching scouting is, its not just our wee group that meets in our hall every week, not just Dunfermline or Scotland or the UK, but an international movement in over 170 countries all across the world and it remains an amazing sight to see 45,000 scouts in one place all having the time of their lives.

HUDSON BEAVERS

During the second half of the year the Beavers took part in some fantastic new adventures and activities, as well as some tried-and-tested fun. A lot of our programmes this term focussed on developing everyday skills for use at Beavers and out in the wider world.

Closing out our work on the Navigator staged badge, we headed out into Abbeyview on a mission—to find the best local chip shop. We set out from the Scout Hall, maps in hand, headed to every chip shop we could find, and sampled the best chips they had to offer. Chips were rated on flavour, crispiness, fluffiness, and value for money. Our overwhelming favourite was Sauro's Chippy!

With lots of new Beavers joining us this term, we needed a night to make sure we knew how to keep our Beaver uniforms looking smart.



We incorporated this into a 'Helping at Home' skills night. The Beavers mastered; rolling their neckies, hanging out washing, hanging up clothes, peeling potatoes, wrapping parcels, washing up, making sandwiches, and more! We hope they've been putting these skills into practice at home!



We returned to one of our favourite programmes later in the term with Pirate night. We got arrr-ty making pirate hats and eyepatches, iced ourselves some pirate treats, and crafted and raced our very own pirate boats, fit to rule the seven seas!

We also started off our Gardeners badge by taking a look at what happens to plants in each of the four seasons, and the tools we can use to help us in the garden. In the New Year, we'll be putting our skills into practice—watch this space!

With the second half of the year came Halloween and Christmas! For the Beavers, both of these involved crafts, games, and mess! We had spider headdresses, flying ghosts, apple bobbing and doughnuts on strings at Halloween, and snowman advent calendars, snowflakes, rocking snowmen, pass-the-parcel, musical bumps, and balloon-bursting games at Christmas.

We've got lots of exciting plans for 2024—it's going to be a good one!

This term the Beavers have been working on their Teamwork Challenge. They have been working together on some activities like understanding their promise and also took part in some team games. We also took a visit up to Townhill park with our bikes and had fun on their cycling track whilst learning about how to be safe when on our bikes. We went over the Safety Badge and in doing this learned about water safety, stranger danger, the green cross code, dangers in the house and how to call for emergency services if required.



We completed the Disability Awareness Badge by doing a blindfolded challenge course, helping a blindfolded beaver through the obstacles so we could understand how it is to be without full sight.

We learned how to communicate in different ways so that people who are blind or deaf could understand us. We found out about the different things that can

assist when you are disabled like wheelchairs, ramps etc.

Communicating in morse code, phone calls and text messages was the subject of another night. The Beavers also learned some new skills whilst working towards completing our Skills Challenge award some of these were making origami frogs, singing camp fire songs and problem solving.



We also worked on our Creative Badge and learnt about endangered animals.



I think everyone enjoyed dressing up in spooky costumes, looking for apples, decorating coffin biscuits and playing games at our annual Halloween party.

To end the year we had some fun doing Christmas crafts and had a boogie at the Christmas party. Some of the Beavers even got to join the Cubs to go see the panto at the Alhambra.

(Oh yes they did!)



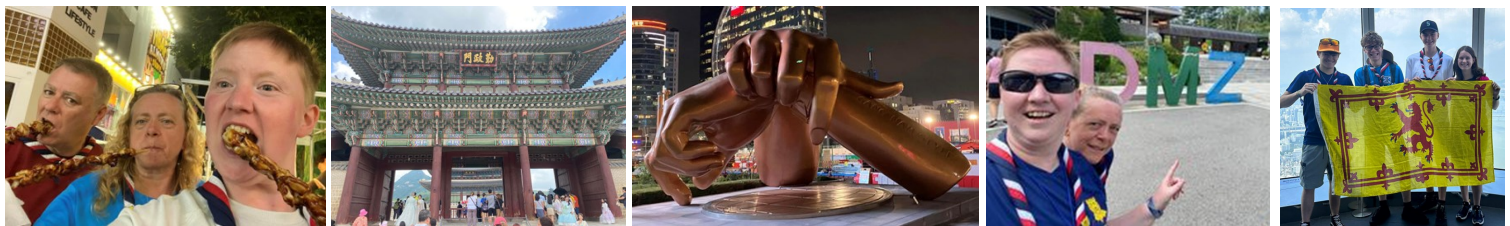


World Scout Jamboree International Service Team

We left the UK on the 25th July and travelled to Seoul for a few nights ahead of travelling to the Jamboree site. Whilst in Seoul we took in the sights, Palaces, traditional villages, street food, markets & more. Laura, Mark & Lorna travelled to the DMZ taking a tour of one of the escape tunnels from the North and the memorial park as well as visiting the view point where we could see over to North Korea. Keiran opted to visit Lotte World amusement park and the North Seoul Tower.



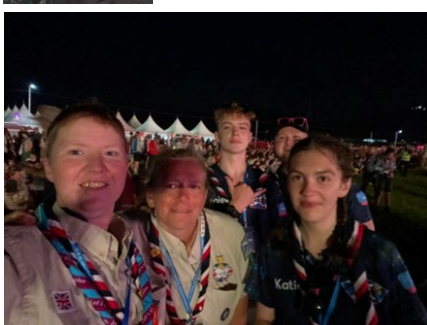

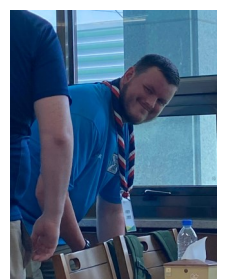

It became obvious very quickly that the organising team were not quite as organised as expected and without us it would have been a much worse situation. IST were deployed digging drainage ditches, shifting pallets, moving tents and other equipment in the sweltering heat and humidity and with a myriad biting beasties to boot. We were also joined with our teams depending on the job allocated prior to arrival, for Laura that meant being a team leader with one of the off site activities, Lorna joined the onsite shuttle bus team, Keiran and Mark with onsite services.



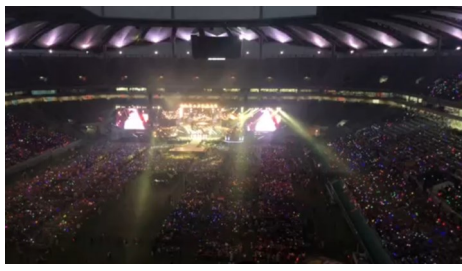

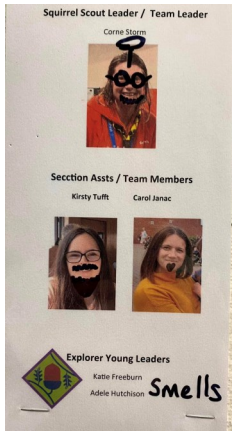

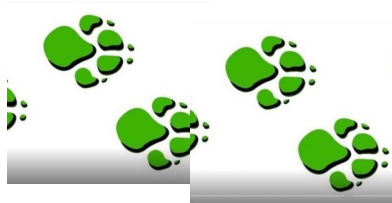
JAMBOREE ON THE INTERNET & JAMBOREE ON THE AIR was held over the weekend of 20th to 22nd Oc-

Arran Pack

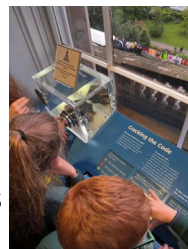

We had a visit from the local TA who put the Scouts through their paces and completed Team Building & Communication exercises.

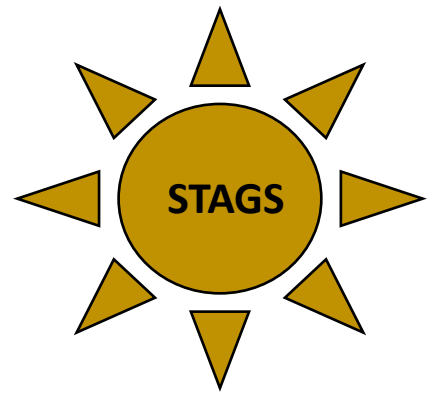
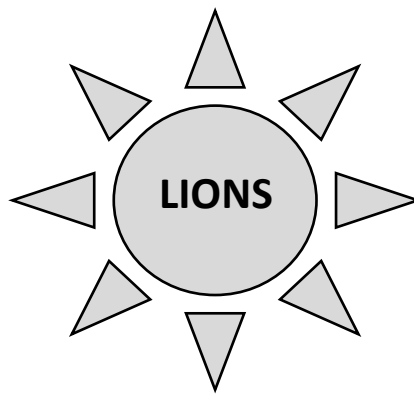
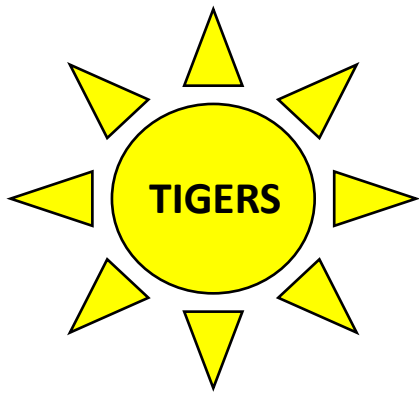


The Autumn term kicked off with some Back to Basics nights, knots, lashings, maps and first aid together with axe and saw skills. A refresher for some but new skills for most.

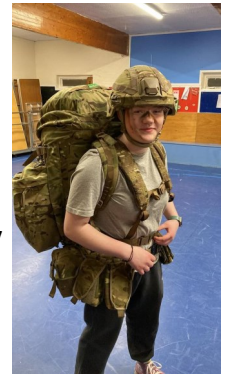
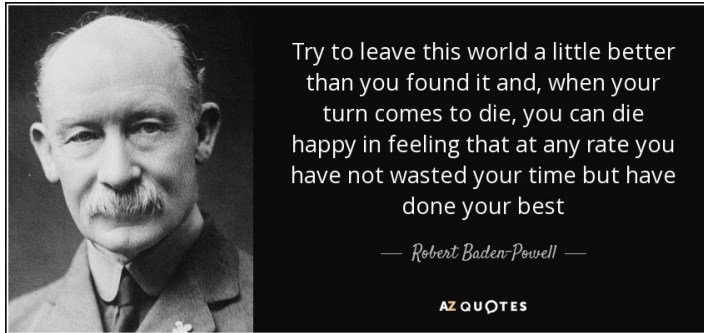


Army Visit

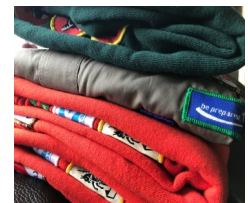

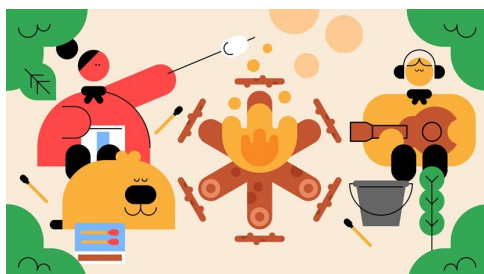
